#### Your first day



All Level 2 and Level 3 Year 1 learners will be in college Monday/Tuesday or Wednesday/Thursday of this week. You will be given your start day at GCSE enrolment when you visit us in August.

On your first day please arrive at WUC main reception located on our main campus for 9am and head to your base room (this will be on the letter given to you at GCSE enrolment).

There will be staff located on the front lawn, at main reception and around the building on hand to support you and direct you to the right room, so don't worry!

# Transport

Making your journey easier

#### **WUC Free Shuttle Bus**

Are you travelling to WUC by train or public bus services?

Writtle University College operate a free shuttle bus service from and to Chelmsford Railway/Bus Station area on a first come first serve basis during FE term times only.

The minibuses stop in Coval Lane, Chelmsford, (by the Council Offices). There is no fee or need to book a place on this service.

Just get yourself to the collection point during operational times and be wearing your student lanyard with student card for identification (for the first week of the academic year, students will only be required to bring their student number until they collect their student I.D card).

If you are using the shuttle service to get back to Chelmsford after College, the pick up point is outside the front of the building at the bus stop.

Morning - (Coval Lane - WUC) 8:00am to 9:15 am - Mon-Fri - Full service

Day - (WUC - Coval Lane) 10am to 3:00pm - Mon-Fri - Limited service

Evening - (WUC - Coval Lane) 3:00pm to 6:00 pm - Mon-Fri - Full service

# Money Matters & Absences

#### We're here to support you

#### **Money Worries?**

Students who find themselves experiencing financial difficulties can apply to our Further Education Bursary fund, once they have commenced studies. Depending on your situation, we may be able to provide financial support to assist with travel, course related costs, meals, childcare and accommodation.

#### 16-19 Free Meal Award:

Free meals can be awarded to students who were in receipt of a free school meal. Evidence is required.

#### **16-19 Discretionary Bursary:**

The bursary is awarded to those students with low household incomes, evidence is required.

#### **16-19 Residential Bursary Fund:**

WUC will only accept students of 18 years and above in halls of residence. A contribution of up to £4,000 can be made towards hall fees or private lodgings. Household income evidence will be required.

#### **16-19 Vulnerable Student Bursary:**

This bursary is for students within one of the following groups:

- Aged 16-17 and in care of the local authority (living with foster carer(s))
- Aged 16-18 and leaving care
- Aged 16-18 and in receipt of Income Support, Universal Credit, ESA, DLA or PIP




#### Go to the WUC Website


1. Go to the Writtle University College Website: writtle.ac.uk/ and at the top right corner click Student Login

2. This will lead to a page where you will need to select **Email** from the list (under web facilities)

#### Log in using your details

3. You will be able to log in to your email:

Your Email address will be your student number followed by @writtle.ac.uk: e.g. 983\*\*\*\*@writtle.ac.uk

Your initial Password (which you should change) will be Wuc followed by your date of birth: WucDDMMYYYY e.g. if your birthday was 1st June 2005, your password would be Wuc01062005

\* You will not be able to access your student email account until you are fully enroled with us and 24 hours has passed.

#### BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE

For September 2023, all students will be required to bring an appropriate laptop for their studies at Writtle University College.

There are a number of important considerations that you should take into account to ensure that you have a suitable machine and are able to run the software provided as part of your course.

#### STUDENT LAPTOP RECOMENDATIONS

Windows, MAC or Chromebook?

Our Recommendation: It's personal choice, but we recommend opting for a Windows based laptop.





#### WHAT WINDOWS VERSION?

The Microsoft Windows operating system is available on most new laptops as "Windows 10" or "Windows 11". Laptops running in "S" (secure) mode only allows installation of Microsoft approved applications from the Microsoft Store. "S" mode can be disabled but this is a permanent change, which cannot be reversed

Our Recommendation: It's personal choice, but be aware of the potential requirement to turn "S" mode off.



#### WHAT SPECIFICATION SHOULD I GO FOR?

The level of specification is largely down to cost. Generally, the higher the specification, the longer usable lifespan of the device. However, the following is a minimum specification:

- RAM 4GB (although 8GB is recommended)
- HDD/SSD 256 minimum


